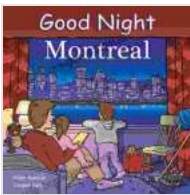


Good Night Montreal, Good Night Our World: A Poetic Tribute to a City's Resilience

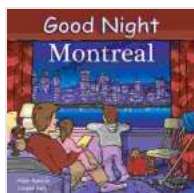

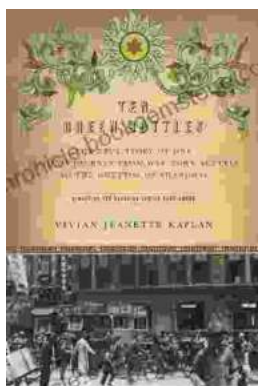
