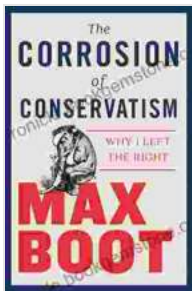


Why I Left the Right: A Journey from Conservatism to Liberalism

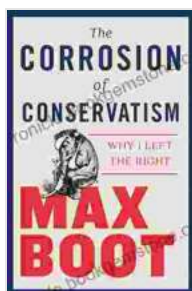
